During this year Vernice Carlock moved to Wray and David Tucker dropped school.

The last day of school we went to Mendenhall's Hatchery north of town We played ball, swam, went boat riding, waded in the creek, and had a good lunch. We all had a super time.

The next September there were twelve Juniors. In November we ordered our rings and pins which came February 21, 1946.
