Theroom represented a palm grove decorated with large imitation palm trees, rose covered arches, and wild flowers. The walls were of varl-colored crepe paper streamers. Japanese lanterns were used to produce the effect of indirect lighting.

Miniature plastic dolls attired in Hawallan costumes were used for place cards. In the center of both tables was a small sandy island in which grew two tiny cork palm trees.
