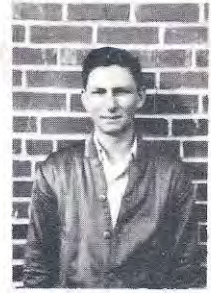


The Senior Class of 1949 dedicates this annual not to any individual, but to an outstanding group of individuals, who brought distinction never before accorded to Haigler High School.

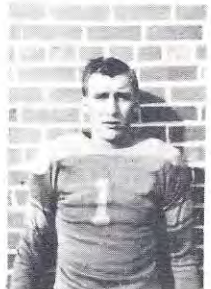
The 1948-49 football team was the most successful six-man football team ever to represent Haigler. From a winless season in 1947, the same group of boys rose to over power eight consecutive foes, and gamely lost to a ninth.

They established a new school scoring record of 426 points in a single season. They were accorded statewide recognition in one of the leading daily newspapers in the state of Nebraska.

They set new records, not to stand forever, but as a goal for the future teams of Haigler High School to aim at. Therefore, our hats are off to all the boys who worked so well together to raise the name of Haigler to a height never before enjoyed in the ranks of football.



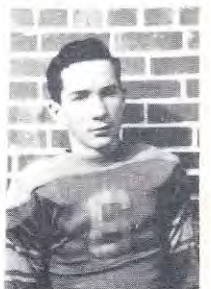

The last day of school we went to Wray. Much to our disappointment, it rained that day, but everyone had a pretty good time.

The next September there were twelve Juniors. During the first semester we lost two members of our class. Naoma Brunick moved to Wray and Rosella Tucker dropped school to be married.

In October we ordered our rings, which arrived the following June. On February 27 we presented the play "Something Old, Something New." On April 14 the Juniors gave a banquet in honor of the Seniors. The theme was "In Fair Hawaii." Mr. Clements was our sponsor. Our teachers that year were Mr. Jones, Mr. Clements, and Mrs. Whitney.

On the last day of school we all went to Horse Creek. Everyone had a good time.

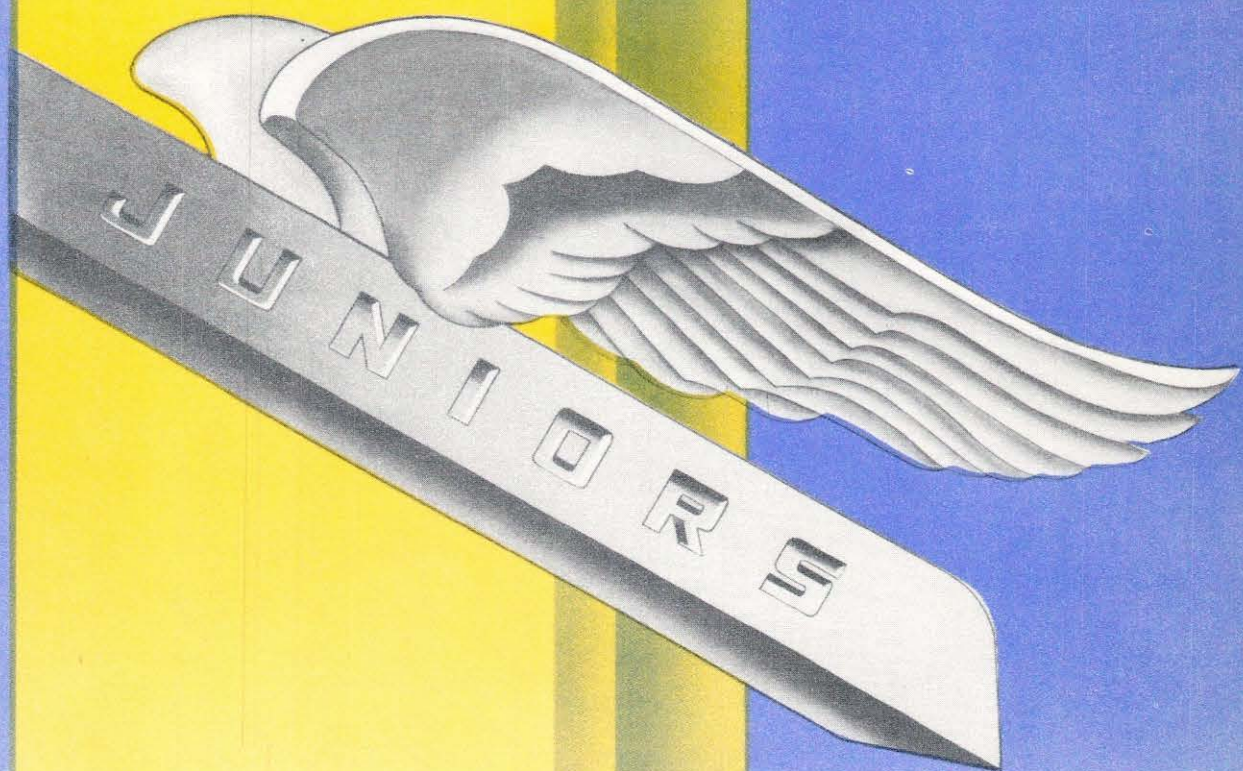
Here I am, nearly home now. I enjoyed my week-end and seeing all my old classmates once again.

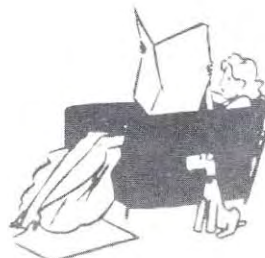

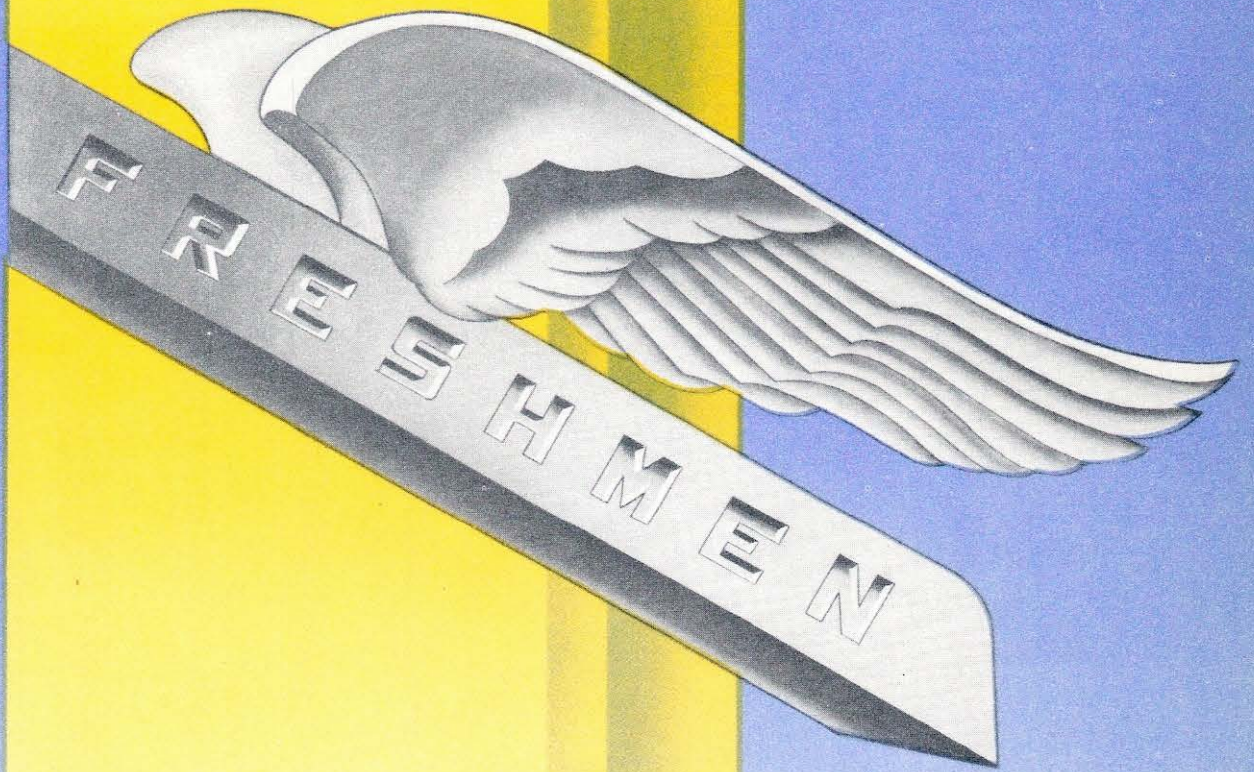
All the girls were members of the Pep Club, and Virginia Wall, Kathleen Havlik, and Dorothy Brown represented the Sophomores in the Glee Club.

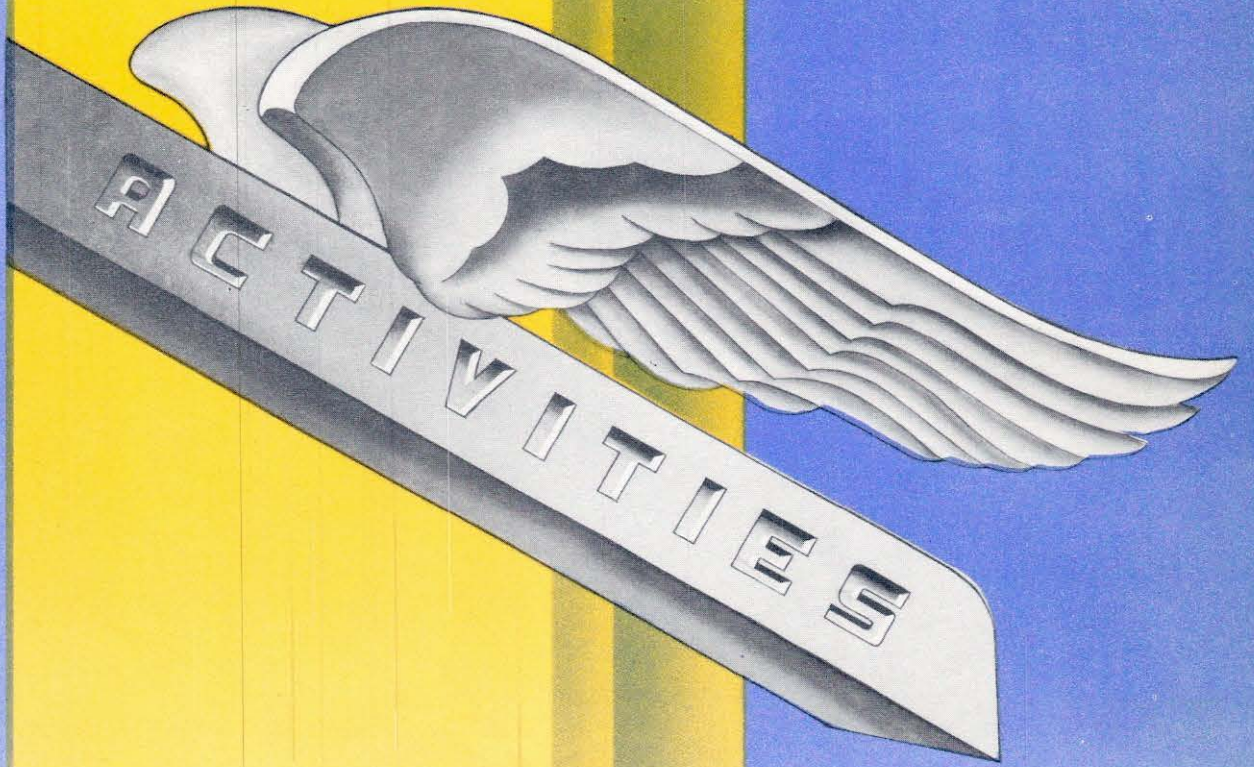
