






JOHN ZWEYGARDT



At the beginning of our Junior year we gained two students Bonita Brown from Yuma and Merle Friesen from Madrid. Not many eventful things happened that year. We want on a hay rack ride north of town and had an all school party. We put on the play "Along Came Charlie". Town talk said it was the best play put on at the Haigler High School for a number of years. We also put on the Junior-senior Semi-formal banquet. After the dinner we danced to the music of the Melody Rustlers. The teachers for that year were Mr. and Mrs. Horner and Mr. Rowley.

During our Senior year we had an all school party and a hay rack ride. This year we lost five pupils. One dropped school and one went to Michigan. They were Dale Zuege and Merle Friesen. Three girls got married- Bonita Brown, Reva Wolfe and Delores Martin. We gained one student when Charles Childers Joined us the beginning of the semester. The teachers for that year were Mrs. Kirkpatrick, Mr. Horner and Mr. Swallow.

There was a play put on by the whole school in which some of the Seniors took part. The play was to raise funds for the electric scoreboard and basketball suits.

Baccalaureate service were held Sunday May 14, 1950 and commencement was May 18, 1950.

LeRoy Rathbun wills his attendance record to Ruth Wall and his quiet ways to Loyd Zuege.






"JUST DUCKY"

The Sophonores gave the Seriors a party John 79, 1960. They were planning on an ine skating party, but the weather man mixed the days up and the ice was a week late.




