




The junior class presented their play "If Mother Only Knew", December 11, 1951. The members of the cast were as follows:



The Grade School Pep Club, consists of twenty-eight grls from the fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth grades and their sponsor Vivienne Ward.



The activities of the pep club are cheering for the boys, school rallies, and selling at the concession stand.




