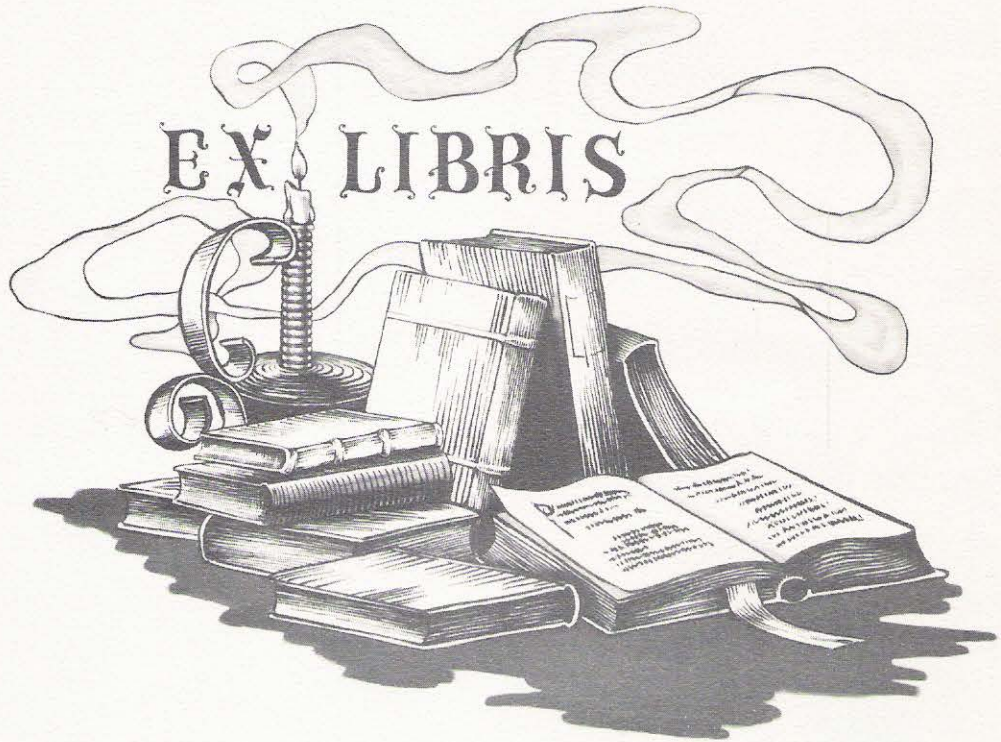
"OUR ALMA MATER"

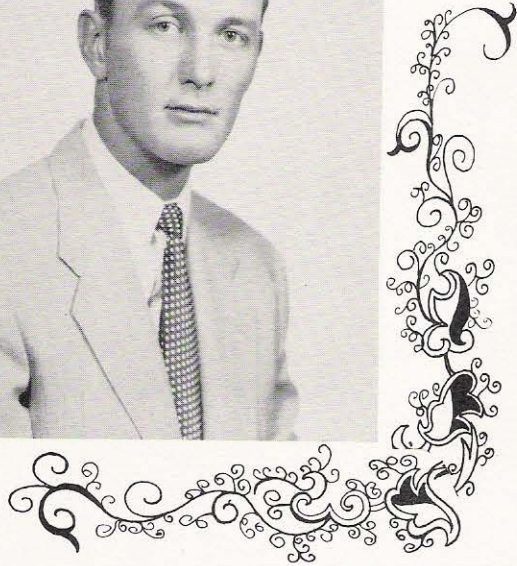

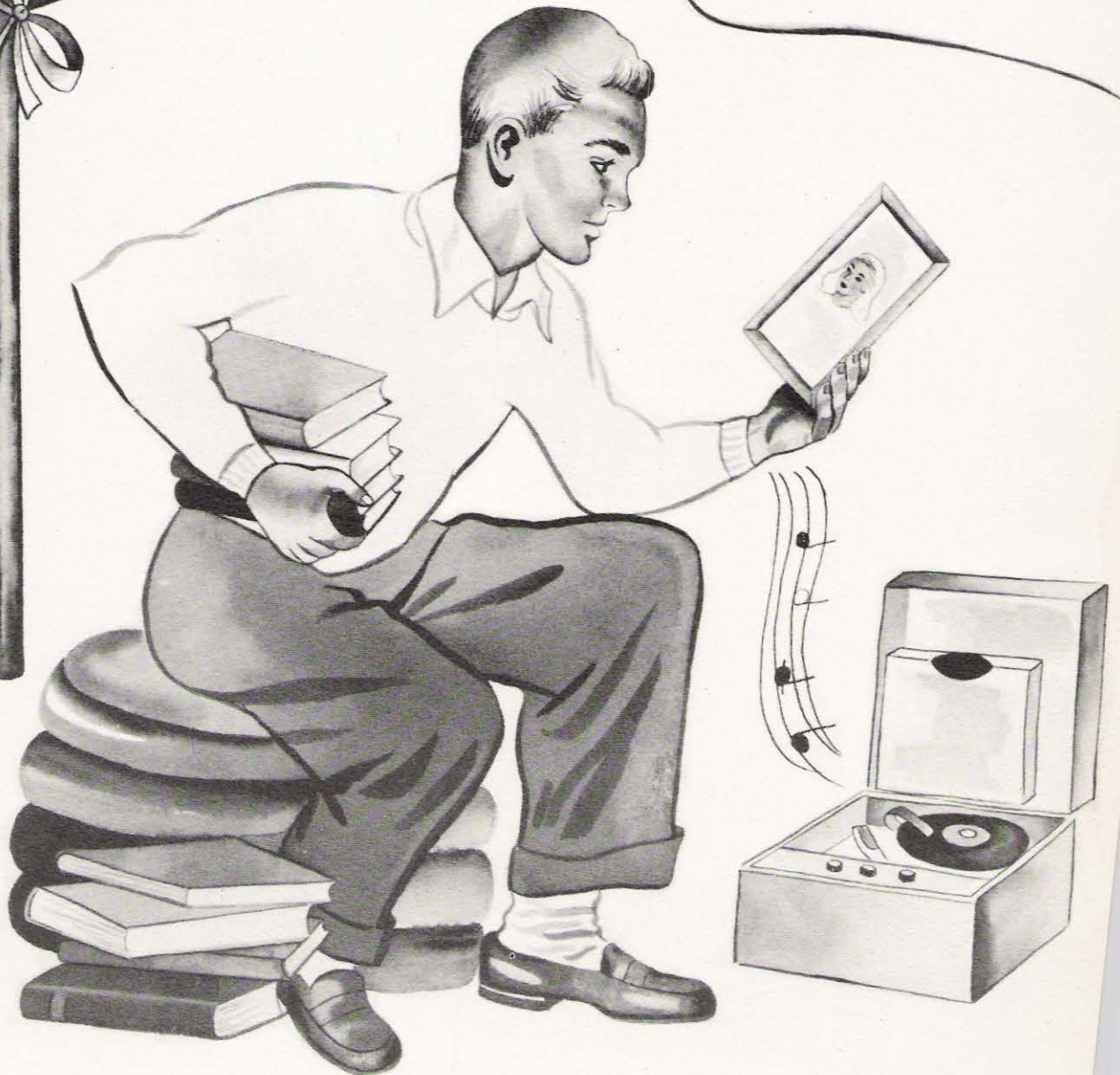

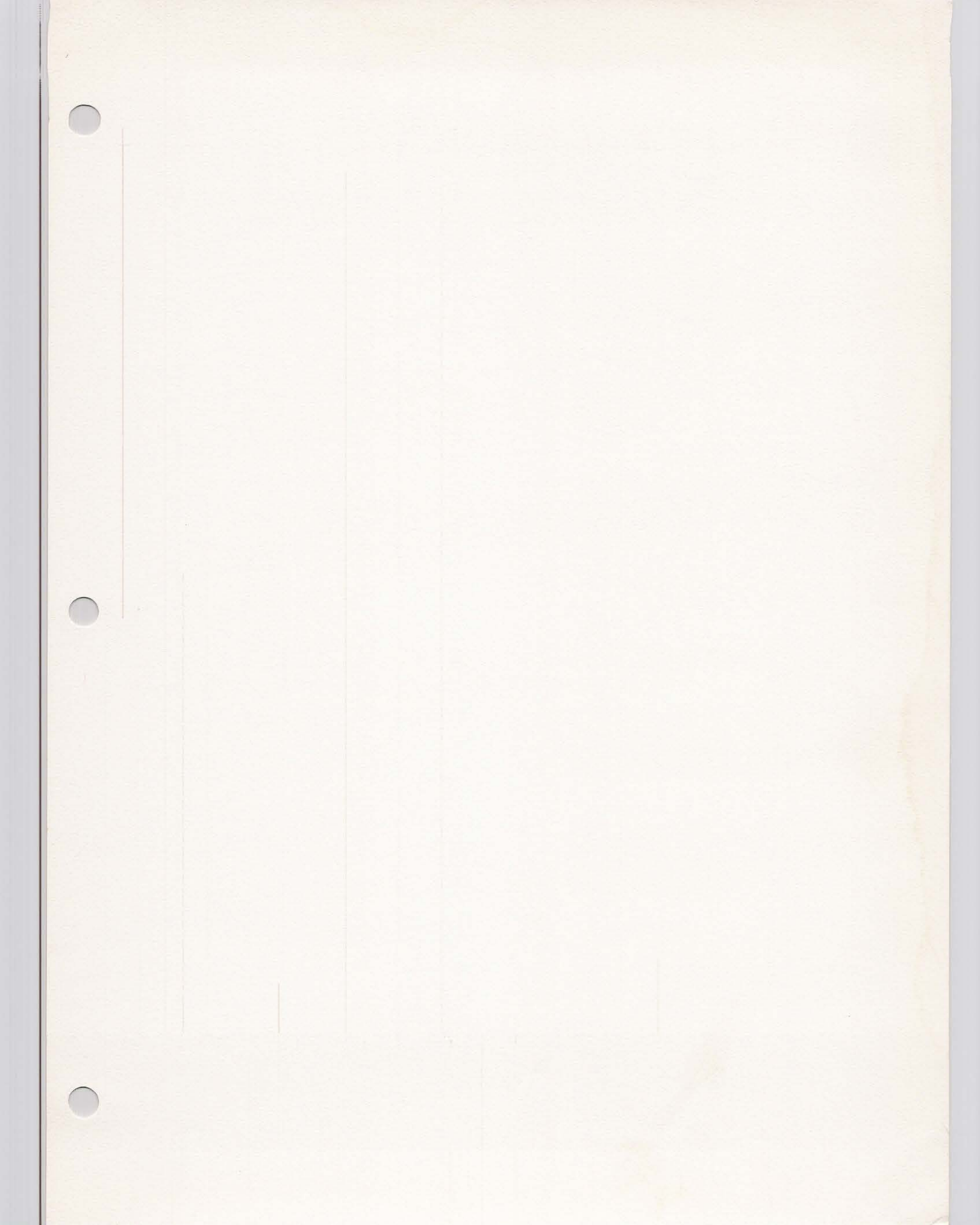
Due to certain circumstances the Haigler Football team Has been cut from seventeen to twelve players. Four of the twelve players are freshmen.
