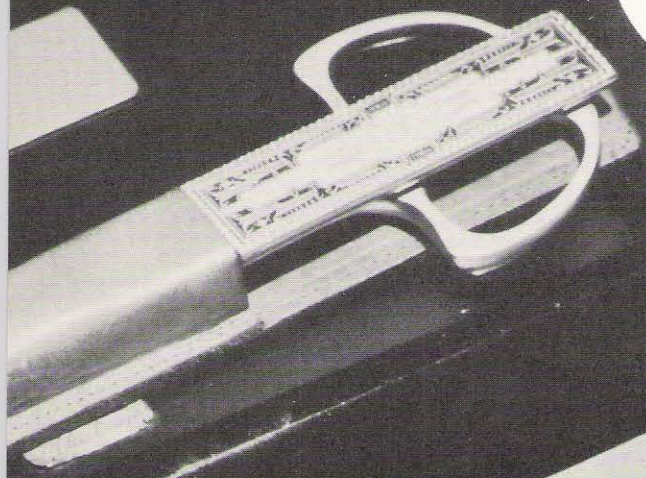
The Annual Staff of the Arickaree would like to dedicate the 1956 Arickaree to the memory of Mr. H. J. McKay.

Small in stature but giants in determination about sizes up the description of the Haigler Grade School Eagletts' basketball team of 1955-56.

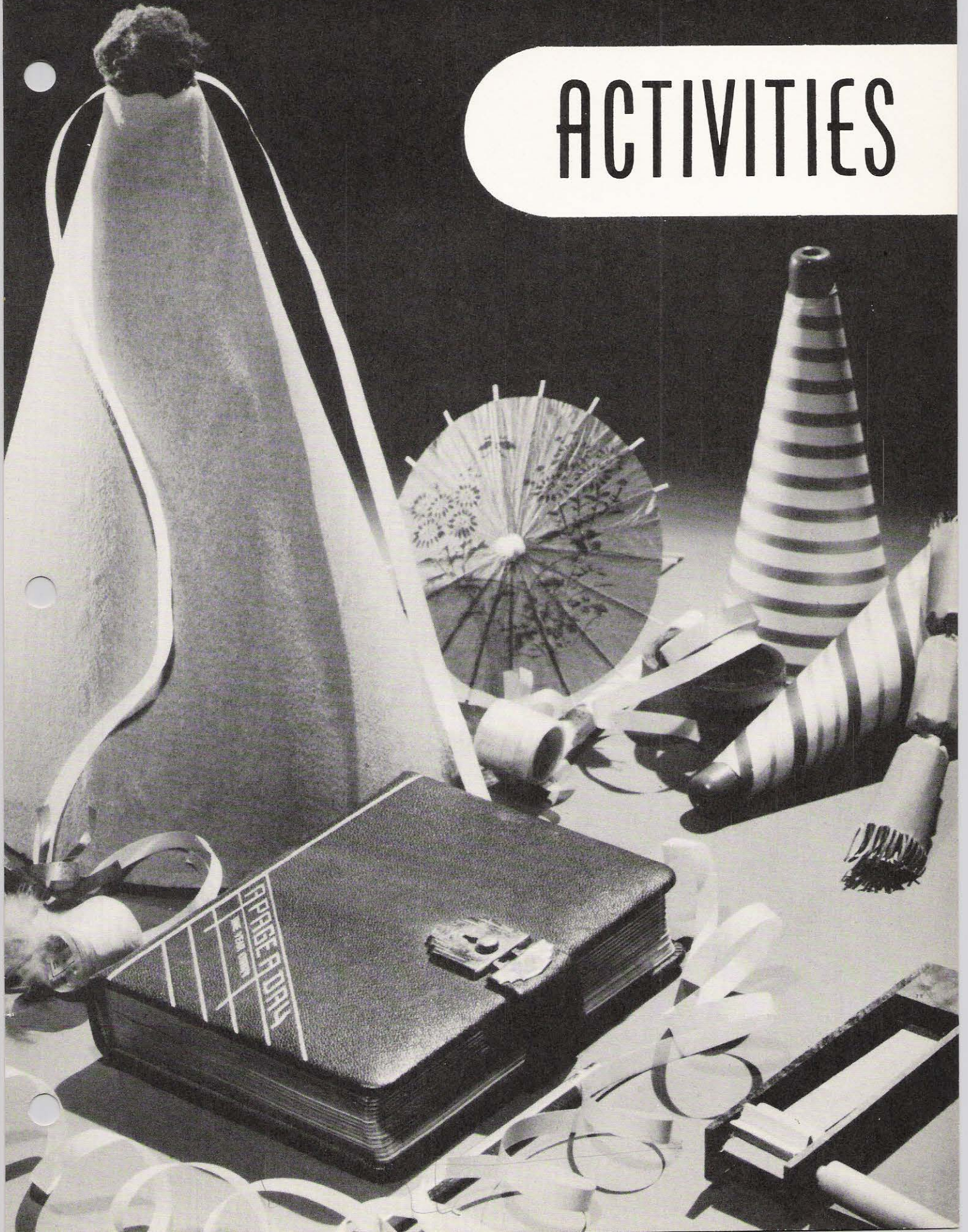
