

The Freshman Initiation was held in September. The poor Freshmen were miserable all day and were happy to see 3:40 arrive.









The Haigler Volleyball team had a very victorious season. The 4 and 1 record was a great improvement over the past few years. We will lose three seniors through graduation.




Everyone from Haigler was very happy with the outcome of the game between the Palisade Panthers and the Haigler Eagles. We won with a score of 22 to 13.


