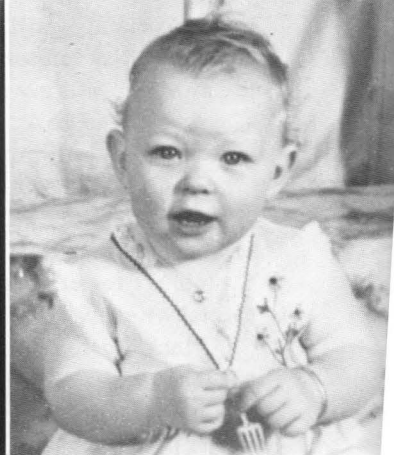
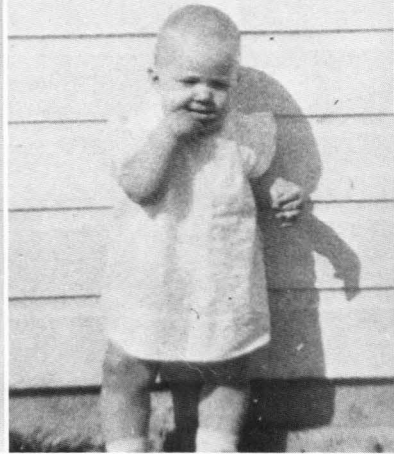
CLASS HISTORY
